

Hearing Set for Victim Charged by DA after Police Break into Her Home and Shoot Her 3 Times

FULTON COUNTY GA – On September 25, 2013, Alpharetta police broke into the home of Amy Bramuchi without a warrant and shot her 3 times. After she awoke, Ms. Bramuchi repeatedly ordered them out of her home. **She even called 911** to try and find out why they were there and get them out of her house. Still, they refused to leave and attempted to forcibly remove her from her home.

Ms. Bramuchi miraculously survived **three .45 caliber, hollow-point bullets** that tore through her body and inflicted permanently debilitating [injuries](#). Although she never harmed anyone on that night, the Fulton County District Attorney's (DA) office **charged her** in April, 2014 with [felony crimes](#) resulting from the incident.

A key preliminary hearing of the charges is scheduled to take place on Wednesday, October 28 at 9:30am in Judge Alfred Dempsey Jr.'s Courtroom 5D. One pre-filed [motion](#) will ask the DA to explain what **legal authority** officers had to violate Ms. Bramuchi's 4th amendment protections and remain in her home until they shot her.

The DA's office may also have to justify why Ms. Bramuchi is being **held without bond** in a [second set of charges](#). In those charges, Ms. Bramuchi is accused of waving a gun in her home at a new roommate who attempted to pick the lock on her bedroom door. **No gun was found after "exhaustive" police searches.** Key questions in both sets of charges include:

- Why did the DA fail to provide Ms. Bramuchi with probable cause hearings?
- Why did the DA fail to recognize that Ms. Bramuchi faced trespassers in both situations?
- Why did the DA fail to recognize the Ms. Bramuchi had statutory immunity from prosecution under a half dozen different Georgia statutes for Use of Force and Defense of Habitation [\[O.C.G.A. § 16-24-3.2\]](#)

Outraged citizens have helped provide publicity and legal aid for Ms. Bramuchi. A **Justice4Amy** [web site](#) tells her story. It seeks donations for her legal defense and personal survival. Ms. Bramuchi has claimed that she was targeted because of her previous complaint that forced Lt. Dan Dreislinki to resign. He served in the same K-9 unit with Trent Lindgren, the officer in charge of the attack on Ms. Bramuchi.
