NARRATIVE

On July 10th 2015 I was dispatched to 204 Woodhaven Way in reference to an assault. Dispatch advised that the caller, John Wyland, said that his roommate, Amy Bramuchi had put a gun to his head. While enroute to the location, dispatch advised that Wyland said that Bramuchi had left the residence in her silver Mercedes. I observed Bramuchi driving the silver Mercedes on Woodhaven Way just inside the entrance to the neighborhood. I, and other arriving officers, activated our patrol vehicle emergency equipment, and the Mercedes came to a stop.

Using my PA I instructed Bramuchi to exit the vehicle with her hands in sight. Bramuchi exited the vehicle and, after turning her cell phone video camera on, complied with commands, and was placed in handcuffs without incident by Officer Munier #383. I asked Bramuchi what had happened at her house, but she refused to say anything. I continued trying different ways to get Bramuchi to talk to me but she refused to talk.

While I and Officer Munier stayed with Bramuchi by her vehicle, Lt Stewart #258 went to the residence and met with Wyland. Lt Stewart told me that Wyland said he had been arguing with Bramuchi earlier about his pending DUI case. Lt Stewart said Wyland told him that he had gone to his room, and then Bramuchi had come into his room, and kept saying "look at me!". Lt Stewart said that Wyland told him that when he looked up, Bramuchi was pointing a shiny black pistol at his head. Wyland said that he ran away and tried to hide behind a wall for protection and called 911. Wyland said that he thought that Bramuchi also called 911 to try and get him in trouble by saying that he was beating her up. Wyland said that while he was hiding in the house, Bramuchi grabbed her car keys and left the house.

Lt Stewart told me that based on his interview of the victim and the recorded 911 call, he advised me that he felt there was enough probable cause to arrest Bramuchi. I arrested Bramuchi for Aggravated Assault O.C.G.A. 16-5-21 and transported her to the Alpharetta Jail where she was turned over to jail staff for booking. The case was turned over to CID for further investigation. I obtained electronic warrant EW-0149570. Wyland filled out a Voluntary Statement which was attached to this report and copy placed in Records. There is also an video and audio recording of Wyland telling Lt Stewart what happened, and an audio recording of Wyland`s 911 call. I faxed copies of the citation, warrant, statement, and report to the Fulton County Complaint Room.

On this date at approximately 2200 hours, I was requested to do an impound on a vehicle that was being impounded incident to an arrest . The vehicle was a 2007 Silver Mercedes C230 GA tag BJJ8958. The vehicle was located at Woodhaven Way just off of Haynes Bridge Road.

Captain Bradley and myself inventoried the vehicle. Items found were

in the passenger compartment a small Brown Purse containing GA DL, several credit cards, AAA card, make up, \$60 cash, keys and other papers. All of these items were delivered to the Alpharetta City jail and turned over to Officer H. Bryant of the Fulton County Sheriff s Office.

The trunk contained an umbrella, road rescue bag with various tools and repair items, windshield sun reflector, First Aid Bag, Tire Leak Repair Spray, fold up chair in a green bag, CPR learning program kit, small grey and pink bag.

All items in the glove box were left as they were.

The rear bumper had some minor damage in three locations which were photographed.

The car along with the car key was turned over to United Towing and hold was placed on the vehicle.

At approximately 2115 hrs I was summoned by dispatch to respond to 204 Woodhaven Way in reference to an aggravated assault that had reportedly taken place there. Upon arrival I met Captain Bradley, Captain West, Lieutenant Rose and Lieutenant Stewart. Officer Kuo was there protecting the integrity of the scene and maintaining the crime scene log. The officers on scene explained that an aggravated assault took place within the residence, and the suspect was stopped in the neighborhood in her vehicle and taken into custody without incident. A search of the suspect and an inventory search of the suspect's vehicle before it was impounded, did not locate the firearm.

The victim, upon talking with responding officers was found to have an outstanding FTA warrant from the City of Milton, and was also taken into custody. I met John Wyland at the Alpharetta annex of the Fulton County Jail. Wyland said he was still very shaken up by the fear caused by the suspect pointing a gun directly at his head. Wyland described the firearm as a large black automatic pistol. He knew that the gun was not a revolver, but said he couldn't speculate on the brand or caliber. Wyland claimed to have never seen his roommate with a gun before the confrontation this date. Wyland said he assumed the suspect kept the weapon in her room, but did not know where.

I then utilized the Fulton County electronic warrant system to obtain a search warrant for the residence, specifically searching for any firearms, ammo and/or firearm related objects.

At approximately 0015 hrs Captain Bradley, Captain West, Lieutenant Rose and I entered the home pursuant to the search warrant. After a cursory look throughout the home, the search concentrated on the suspect's bedroom. The door had a keyed lock on it and was locked. The suspect's keys were obtained rather than forcing entry into the bedroom. Inside a drawer of the entertainment center by the bed was located two ammo boxes of .38 ammunition. In the same drawer were two safety lock keys that belong to a Taurus firearm. Inside the suspect's closet was located a plastic gun box that once contained a 9MM Smith and Wesson pistol. The pistol was not found in the box or in the townhouse. A spent .45 caliber shell casing was located in a kitchen drawer and also collected. All items were photographed in place, then collected and taken to Alpharetta PD evidence. After an exhaustive search within the home, no more evidence was located. It should be noted that officers were very careful to not damage anything while inside the unit. A copy of the search warrant and a property receipt detailing the items collected were left conspicuously on the kitchen counter. The unit was secured with the suspect's keys upon completing the search.

All items collected were packaged and turned into evidence. The suspect's keys were packaged and listed separated so that they could be placed into evidence for safekeeping until the suspect can retrieve them.

Photos of the items collected will be attached to this report. I did not talk to suspect Bramuchi.

On 07/13/2015 I was contacted by ADA Lauren McAuley about this case. I gave her the details I knew of the case and

On 7-10-15 at 2050 hrs I responded to 204 Woodhaven Way on a person armed call with other units. Dispatch advised that a male caller was on the line and saying Amy Bramuchi had a handgun and was pointing it at his head. I arrived at Woodhaven Way and Haynes Bridge Rd. where Officers Capps, Munier, and Pelts were completing a traffic stop on Bramuchi in her Mercedes sedan. She was exiting her car and complying with verbal commands. Ofc. Munier handcuffed and searched her without incident. She was detained on the stop while Lt. Stewart , Lt. French and Ofc. Kuo responded to the residence to speak with the male complainant. Capt. West, Capt. Bradley and Detective Shoffeit responded to the scene. Bramuchi was arrested for one count of Aggravated Assault by Capps. Detective Shoffeit obtained a search warrant for the residence for the handgun. Ofc. Pelts completed the vehicle inventory and impound. I assisted Det. Shoffeit , Capt. West and Capt. Bradley search the residence at 204 Woodhaven Way. Two boxes of .38 special handgun ammunition was located in the master bedroom(rear) TV stand drawer. Also located were two small Taurus handgun safety lock keys. The handgun was not located. Nothing further at this time.

On 10 July 2015 around 2048 hours I was dispatched to 204 Woodhaven Way on a person armed call. Upon arrival the suspect, Amy Brumuchi was detained by other officers and I went with Lt. French and Officer Kuo to meet the caller/victim.

We met John Wyland in the middle of the street. Wyland told us that Brumuchi had pointed a gun at his head. I asked him if he would write out a witness statement and he said yes. It took a while for him to write the statement as he became irritated with us and wrote a lot of text about things that had happened weeks ago. At one point he stood up and said he was done and when I asked him to sign it he got mad and said that he was not finished (he wrote this as part of his statement). I told him to sit down and continue writing.

After a while, I checked what he had written and saw that he was no longer writing about events this night so I asked him to sign it. After he signed it, Officer Walters with Milton PD arrested Wyland on a Milton warrant for failure to appear.

Later, officer Kuo and I saw that the front door to the residence was wide open so we went inside and cleared it to make sure no one else was in the house. We then closed the front door and secured the scene for CID.

Captain Bradley, Captain West and Detective Shoffeit arrived and after a search warrant was obtained, they searched the house along with Lt. Rose. I assisted with the search and then later left the scene with them.

Supplemental Report: 1507-0222

On 07/13/2015, I responded to 204 Woodhaven Way at the request of Lt. Jones (CID). Lt. Jones asked me to conduct an article search in the wood line behind the 204 address based on an aggravated assault case from 07/10/2015 (1507-0222). Lt. Jones said the victim described the suspect as carrying a shiny black semi-automatic style gun during the assault. On the day of the incident officers searched the front yard area, but did not search the wood line behind the residence.

Upon my arrival, I met with Ofc. Wessel at the front of the neighborhood. We walked around the back of the residences (multi-family townhome building). The wood line was extremely thick with brush, fallen trees, rough terrain and miscellaneous debris. I began casting my K-9 partner, Lekso off-line after giving the command of an article search. I ensured the dog did not enter the curtilage of the suspect's backyard, but there was no fence separating the backyard and the adjacent wood line. There was a fence separating the 204 address and the adjacent yards. I observed pink flags marking the neighbor's yard just to the right of the 204 address. It appears this yard was recently surveyed and marked, so I used those flags as a guideline for the rear curtilage of the 204 address. The dog did not alert to the presence of human odor on any items and was returned to the patrol vehicle. No evidence was located.
