

How to Safely, EZ Vote at Home on Full, Verifiable Ballot

ATLANTA GA - **VoterGA** urges that **all Georgians vote from the comfort of their own homes** to alleviate any COVID-19 health concerns, protect their ballot privacy and help ensure their votes are counted correctly as cast on a verifiable, auditable and recount capable ballot.

Any registered voter can get a mail-in ballot application for an election from their county registrars or by downloading it from the Secretary of State web site:

Once the application is completed it can be scanned and returned to most counties via Email. Voters who are concerned about sending their personal address and birth date in an Email can also identify where to mail the application by getting the county election office address from the Secretary of State web site:

Voters will receive a real, full ballot from the county, not a barely legible selection summary. Once completed, voters can mail or deliver their ballots to a county office or annex. Voters **cannot** turn in a mail-in ballot at the precinct on Election Day but can bring it, have the poll manager spoil it, and vote electronically there. Voters also **cannot** turn in other voters' mail-in ballots unless those voters previously checked the disabled box on their application.

Voters can further confirm that their ballots were received and counted as follows:

- Go to the [My Voter Page](#) at the Secretary of State web site;
- Submit your last name, first initial, county and birth date in the login box;
- Click on the Absentee Ballot Status link in the lower left hand box.
