

## **TRANSPARENCY LEGISLATIVE**

February 21, 2021

All General Assembly members,

During the month of December, the Senate Judiciary Sub Committee and House Government Affairs Committee, chaired by Sen. Ligon and Rep. Blackmon respectively, collected an overwhelming array of convincing facts & evidence indicating wrongdoing in the conduct of the November 3<sup>rd</sup> election. Active lawsuits filed in Georgia have provided even more evidence concerning both the November 3<sup>rd</sup> and January 5<sup>th</sup> elections. For example:

1. At least four sworn affidavits from 20-year poll managers indicate they handled counterfeit ballots in the November 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> Fulton County hand count audit. The potential numbers of these ballots scale to the tens of thousands based on the samples they personally witnessed;
2. There is concrete visual evidence from the State Farm Arena videos of illegal scanning, rescanning and hiding of ballots processed during the November 3<sup>rd</sup> election;
3. There are massive, inexplicable vote spikes in Fulton, DeKalb and other counties from the mail-in ballot processing for both the November 3<sup>rd</sup> and January 5<sup>th</sup> elections;
4. The Dominion voting systems inexplicably failed to tabulate or operate correctly in several counties during both the November 3<sup>rd</sup> and January 5<sup>th</sup> elections;
5. There is evidence that the Dominion system flipped votes from Donald Trump to Joe Biden in the November 3<sup>rd</sup> election.

Therefore, we call upon any member of the legislature who is truly concerned about election integrity to provide assurance to Georgia voters by taking these simple legislative steps for election transparency:

1. **Make Ballots publicly available** (per 2019 [VoterGA SAFE Voting Commission recommendations](#))
2. **Make Ballot images publicly available** ([per 2019 VoterGA SAFE Commission recommendations](#)) (SOS legal counsel claim of AG issuing an opinion that ballot images should not be public is false)
3. **Require counties to allow their election management system to be imaged upon demand for independent forensic exams** (this requires only an hour to copy the server for forensic exam and does not impact election processing in any way)
